**STATUS OF REALIGNMENT**

(Handouts Provided) To date, Napa County has had 77 offenders released on mandatory supervision; of those 12 have completed supervision. We have received 122 PRCS offenders; of those, 39 completed their time on supervision. Of the 122 PRCS cases we have supervised, 20 completed their time within the 12 month period with no new charges, no flash incarcerations and remained out of custody since being released; 4 closed prior to 12 month period being over for doing so well and 2 terminated for different reasons; 2 people failed and went back to prison, 28 had flash incarcerations and 4 had new charges. In comparison to last year's formal probation numbers, we closed 845 cases 64 of those had new misdemeanor charges, 79 had new felony charges, and 26 went to prison.

In June we had 2,076 adults on formal probation, 65 PRCS, and 52 on mandatory supervision.

The CPOC Realignment Report with data reported as of March 31' 2013 was reviewed. More county information can be viewed on the CPOC website.

## **STAFF SECURE RESIDENTIAL FACILITY**

We are going forward with the SB 1022 application. The permanent staff secure facility will be at the new jail site. The deadline is October 24<sup>th</sup>. Be on look out for phone calls to offices to get information needed for application. Planned date to take to the Board of Supervisors is October 1, 2013. There is a \$20 million cap, but we are looking at \$14-16 million range. If we don't get funding, we will come back as group and decide how we will be moving forward.
