**APPROVAL OF SEPTEMBER 5, 2013 MEETING MINUTES**

**COUNTY/COURT INTEGRATION PROJECT**

(Handouts Provided) Rick Feldstein did not attend today's meeting and was unable to share presentation. CJNET is now up and running at the Public Defender's and District Attorney's office. IT is currently working with Adult Probation and unsure of completion date.

The Public Defender's office has access to the Court's computer system in the courtroom on their tablets. Also, the computers in the primary courtrooms allow you to have access to materials for cases being heard on that day and the following day.

**STATUS OF REALIGNMENT**

There has been a noticeable increase in contraband in the jail, such as drugs and needles which are being used for drugs and/or for making tattoo guns. They also have the risk of being used as a weapon against another inmate or on a Correctional Officer. Race segregation and aggression between inmates and inmates on officers has also increased in 2012/2013. The increase is not necessarily coming from just realignment inmates, but has been more noticeable since realignment started.

Public Defender's office has seen a pick-up in the number of offenders who have been booked on parole revocations, but at this point not a significant amount to cause many issues. Since July, there have been four revocation hearings which coincides with what was projected.

**STATE SURVEY**

**JAIL POPULATION UPDATE**

(Handouts provided) The graphs that are seen every month are generated from weekly reports since July 2011. There has been some increase in jail population and running at high capacity. Looking to see if there are individuals that can serve on alternative programs such as CCWP and putting plans in place in case inmates need to be housed at different locations.

EIR for new jail site is still in the draft stages and certification looking to be completed in early 2014 around March/April. Option on land went to the Board in October and currently there are some additional environmental tests being run. If all goes well by early spring we would be looking at the option of purchasing land.

#### **SB 1022 APPLICATION UPDATE**

Liz submitted the application days before due date, but is now working on answering new questions that the state sent to us the day before the application was due. It is believed that a strong application was submitted and we were able to show that efforts are being made at the jail in regards to population. Presentation on application will be done the first week of December in Sacramento and we should know in January if we will be receiving funds.
