**APPROVAL OF FEBRUARY 13, 2014 MEETING MINUTES**

**PROPOSAL FROM PROBATION (ACTION ITEM)**

(Handout Provided) Probation is requesting an increase in allocations from the current \$29,967 to \$63,451 to cover full time staffing for the DEJ program. The referrals have been much higher than expected and currently have over 170 referrals. There have been some issues that have arisen since the program started. First, is the amount of monolingual Spanish speakers has increased and we now need to incorporate a separate group for these offenders and the assessments also need to be completed in Spanish which adds to the work load. Secondly, the number of referrals is much higher than anticipated currently at an average of 4-8 weekly and the assigned probation officer cannot complete the work in 10 hours.

The Board voted and approved to increase allocation for a full time probation officer for the realigned population so a probation officer can be diverted to the DEJ program.

**2013 REALIGNMENT STATISTICS**

Napa County is 5<sup>th</sup> in state using split sentences, at 75%. We have had 115 mandatory supervision cases ordered and of those 70 are currently being supervised and have closed out 30 cases that completed their supervision time. There have been 137 post-release community supervision people from prison and currently 66 of those are being supervised. There have been 71 cases closed out and of those 10% have re-offended and convicted of a new offense. The

number of probationers is up and there are currently over 2,000 adult probationers. In 2013 there were 71 or 5.5% that were convicted of a new offense. The number of probationers that failed or revoked and sent back to prison was 3.4%.

## **STATUS OF REALIGNMENT**

### **Jail Update:**

Lenard stated there has been an increase in staff assaults at the jail with most recently an officer was slashed in the face with a razor blade. They have had to lock down parts of the jail, cancelled visitations, and do cell searches for weapons. There has also been racial tension going on between Hispanic groups and African American groups.

### **Law Enforcement Update:**

Rich stated there have been issues with Meth. They have been working with Jaye and the Alcohol and Drug counselors to try and get offenders services before having to send them to the jail.

### **Victim Advocates Update:**

Aimee updated us with numbers of releases and revocations. There have been 16 county parole revocations, 57 parole board hearings, 473 services have been provided to victims of realignment type offenses, 18 supervised releases, and 140 1170(h) cases. Aimee agreed to look at numbers since county parole numbers do not match jail numbers
