JAIL POPULATION REPORT

Met with Solano County Sherriff's Office and they agreed to take 70 inmates so we are able to clear out housing area that got damaged in the earthquake. The Board of State and Community Corrections came out and they have reduced the daily capacity rate to 204 beds and have a temporary loss of 60 beds. They have given us nine months to figure out how long it will take us to get those beds back.

A plan has been established to be able to have attorney visiting. Initially, we were doing it at the court building. We were able to get two trailers that are located in the back of jail. One can be used for visitation expansion and the other we can possibly be used to deliver services to the inmates. Also, looking at getting iPad's to deliver interactive services.

A meeting will be set to look at alternative sites to send re-offenders who have mental health issues.

FUNDING FOR DISTRICT ATTORNEY/PUBLIC DEFENDER

(Handout Provided) BSCC released definition of Recidivism.

RECIDIVISM REDUCTION GRANT

Governor set aside money for Recidivism Reduction Grant where money can go to community agencies. There is a onetime \$50,000 coming to Napa, but money will have to be split between five groups and each will be getting \$10,000 that will have to be used within four years. It has to

relate to adult realignment, juvenile programming or juvenile delinquency prevention. There will be a subcommittee to create RFP.

STATUS OF REALIGNMENT FROM PARTNERS

Alcohol and Drug assessments at the jail have been problematic, but looking at possibility at doing them over the phone.

BI is up and running at the ERC building and have 70% of clients have been checking in and 60% have been attending their groups.
