JAIL POPULATION REPORT

As of Sunday, majority of inmates back from Solano County. The jail was at 204 beds as 60 beds were lost due to the earthquake but the State Board of Corrections came out and inspected the facility and the jail has been re-rated to 264 beds. After a long process of getting earthquake repairs done the old jail cells have been repaired. About 27 inmates still in Solano County and the plan is to keep at least 27-30 inmates there for at least the rest of the year. This will allow us to be able to look at a couple of projects, one of which is the basement project where a dorm style unit will be taken over and cells will be put in. Those cells will give an additional 30 cells or a total of 60 beds. This project will take approximately 12-14 months to complete and once completed jail will be back at full capacity.

Christina Wilson is the new Correctional Lieutenant. The Assistant Director Position is now open for recruitment.

DOSAGE PROBATION

Dosage Probation is going live on Monday. Court orders will be starting to come in with pre-sentence reports. Training with the District Attorney's office will be in two weeks and a date still needs to set for the Public Defender's office.

FY 14/15 GROWTH FUNDS RECEIVED

(Handout provided) This year in growth money we have already received \$551,000 and we had only budgeted for \$400,000. Next year we are anticipating \$786,000 in growth money. We are maintaining a healthy fund balance. Right now we are projecting about \$2.5M when we end this year. We have \$89,000 for the innovations sub account which is being used for the tablet program.

There is already money set aside for the Staff Secure Facility so we are able to staff it when it is ready to go live. We have been using the training money and have received all CIT training

dates and now getting people scheduled to attend. The simulator has arrived and the trainers have been trained.

STATUS OF REALIGNMENT FROM PARTNERS

District Attorney's office has the Family Justice Center Conference next week. The consulting team for the Alliance for Hope International will be out April 27-28 to have the opportunity to meet our community. The morning of the 27th there will be coffee at 8 a.m. at the City Hall council chambers if people would like to attend. Next week is the National Crime Victims Rights Week. Victim advocates will be screening documentary on April 11th at 5:30 at New Tech High School.

Health and Human Services was successful in getting \$1.9M grant to build a crisis stabilization services program. Right now there is an emergency response team whose primary job is to, once medically cleared, find placement for them. What crisis stabilization services does it that they have a psychiatrist, nurses, as well as mental health support stabilize and have them able to get out-patient treatment immediately. This is a significant upgrade in ability to deal with significant mental health issues in the community. It is in the design phase with the architects now and are hoping to be able to launch this in June-July of next year.

Public Defender's office has been able to fill vacant positions. Drug Court graduation happening April 21st and BI Transition Ceremony May 5th.

Police Department update on BottleRock. Happening May 27-29 and they will be bumping up their attendance by 5,000 people. They are hoping to be able to divert people to McAlister's instead of the jail. The city and county have been working well together to have consultants come out to look at our service delivery in the homeless system. On April 13th there will be a Suicide Awareness presentation from 6:30-8:00 p.m. at Redwood Middle School.

BI will be having a graduation on May 5th at 6:00 p.m. at Napa County Office of Education. Hoping to be able to move back into the old facility by May 20th. BI has worked with Health and Human Services to go for a grant and looking to see if they are able to create program to help the homeless population. They will be assessing 20 individuals between the Hope Center and the shelters. They will be using the LSCMI's and Criminal Thinking Scale to do assessments then taking the data of those individuals and move forward with a program design to see what can be done with them and getting them off the streets.

Probation update of February and March data, there is not a huge difference in numbers. Continue to be successful with the folks on probation. There have been six releases from prison that have come to us. Need to continue working on cases that are on warrant status, currently over 800 probationers on warrant status. Drug and Alcohol Counselor now embedded at probation and assessments are being done faster and getting folks into treatment and will soon be getting new Eligibility Worker.
