PUBLIC COMMENT

Jerod Rudolph from Up Trust talked briefly about what his agency does. They provide a text messaging service to send text reminders for future Court dates and department information. Currently working with Contra Costa County and they have seen an increase of people showing up to Court, from 70% it went up to 95%. Stated CCP meeting was well run and the committee echoed a lot of the same concerns other counties had.

APPROVAL OF August 4, 2016 MINUTES

No quorum at the time of this item.

JAIL POPULATION REPORT

Currently the ADP at the jail is 200 and have 35 housed in Solano County.

The jail basement project, where we will be taking open dorms and converting them into cells, started two weeks ago. We are being told the project should take less than a year to complete.

PROPOSAL FROM PROBATION-FUNDING NEW POSITION (ACTION ITEM)

(Handout provided) Requesting a Probation Officer I/II position be added to the Adult Division to assist them in getting their caseloads down in order to be more effective and have appropriate size caseloads. In FY 14/15 a new formula for SB 678 was developed and our allocation increased. The formula sets a base allocation and creates incentive payments for reducing revocations to the state prison. The result was a significant increase in funding based on past performance. Probation budgeted \$500,000 in this year's budget but the actual allocation is \$573,809. The increase in revenue resulted in a decrease in the Local Community Corrections Account. Probation also received funding to assist with the early release of second strike inmates on PRCS. To date, Napa has received \$133,250 and these monies can also pay for the new probation officer salary. It is being requested to use the additional SB 678 monies received above budget (\$73,809) to pay for a new probation officer this fiscal year. In future years the position will be funded with SB 678, PRCS, and Realignment if needed.

ADVOCACY FUNDING FOR DISTRICT ATTORNEY

(Handout provided) Three years ago the District Attorney's Office was funded for a 1.0 FTE Victim Witness Advocate position through the CCP. For the last three years one advocate has been providing services to victims of realignment eligible crimes, such as information on Marsy's Law, the justice system, case status, victim impact statements, crisis intervention, and community resources. Have realized that specific needs for realignment related cases are restitution assistance and notification. This FY 15/16 has been the busiest with 445 new victims

with an average of 37 victims per month, FY14/15 had 260 new victims with an average of 22 victims per month, and FY 13/14 had 348 new victims with an average of 29 per month. 29% of our case load is realignment related.

RECIDIVISM REDUCTION GRANT

The RFP was re-opened to be able to disburse the last \$10,000. Legacy was awarded the last of the grant and will be using the money to pay for their field trip to LA. All other agencies have been using the money they received. It looks like we will not be receiving this grant again, if anything changes and State decides to continue with this we will let you know.

FY 16/17 GROWTH FUNDS RECEIVED

Within the next 30 days we will be receiving from the state \$676,000 in growth funds. Total base for FY 16/17 is \$3.4 million compared to FY 15/16 base of \$3.2 million.

WORDS TO DEEDS

Words to Deeds is an annual event, it is an invitation only 2-3 day event and will be held November 2-4. The focus will be on the mentally ill that are in-custody. We will be using realignment training fund money to cover costs of our hotel stay for one night.

STATUS OF REALIGNMENT FROM PARTNERS

District Attorney's office has lost their misdemeanor attorney.

Sheriff's Department has no updates.

Jail is working on getting body scanner because of the increase of contraband coming into the jail.

Public Defender's has office no update.

Courts will set up meeting with the judges regarding Prop. 47. Construction on the 2nd floor court room will be completed by the spring time.

Day Reporting Center's next graduation is on November 10th, invite will be going out soon.

Probation in the last three months we have had 81% successful probation completions, 100% PRCS completions, and 67% mandatory supervision completions.

Alcohol and Drug have applies for CMSP grant to serve Calistoga. We are hopeful to get grant for sobering center.

Mental Health has filled their Jail Release Coordinator position and Forensic Mental Health is now fully staffed.
