**JAIL POPULATION REPORT**

Currently 180 in-custody and 44 housed in Solano County. The jail basement project is ongoing, once complete it will add 60 maximum security beds. Will be holding interviews for sergeant position and promoting Paul Hernandez as the new lieutenant.

**FY 16/17 GROWTH FUNDS ALLOCATION**

Receiving \$676,000 from the state in growth funds, roughly \$100,000 more than last year. Statewide we did receive less than anticipated. Allocation for 15/16 went up. BOS will be approving building specs for re-entry program on Tuesday.

**PROP 47 GRANT PROPOSAL**

This is money that is going back to the counties related to prison savings. There are different ways money can be spent. It looks at mental health, substance abuse and housing. The thought was that we could use half of the money we get could go to a community organization for housing. The idea would be to help our mentally ill, substance abusing folks who are coming out of jail or prison to have the door open for them for housing.

Group has agreed to move forward with grant application. Will continue to meet and talk to providers. Application is due at the end of February.

**STATUS OF REALIGNMENT FROM PARTNERS**

District Attorney announced Gary's retirement. Allison Haley is the new District Attorney.

Victim Advocates has four advocates and will be hiring one more in near future. In October 34 cases were assisted and in November 40 new victims assisted.

Sheriff's Department talked about Napa County not being sanctuary count, it is listed as one in error. We do not honor the detainees and we protect victims that are undocumented from being deported. Deportations have gone down to three in 2015 and zero in 2016.

Jail has no updates.

Public Defender's office talked about probation now being able to do flash incarcerations. This will go into effect in January.

Napa Police Department has been working with the homeless. Winter shelter still open but are still finding people not using shelter. Also, have been attending a lot of community meetings regarding immigration issues.

County Counsel has no updates.

Courts will be implementing new case management system next summer.

Geo thanks everyone who attended the graduation. Currently, 100 people in program.

Probation is moving slowly with Dosage Probation, about 40 participating. We will possibly have first graduate in April.

Mental health will find out next month if they will be receiving funding for certified behavioral health community clinic. If funding is received we will be able to expand on mental health services. .
