1. CALL TO ORDER - WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

2. PUBLIC COMMENT

Yolanda Schronbrun from League of Women Voter's of Napa County is present as an observer. No Public comment at this time.

3. MEETING MINUTES

5. MEMBERSHIP (ACTION)

Review the application received for the Individual Representing Victims vacancy and make recommendation to the board.

6. REENTRY UPDATE

We are in discussion regarding the operations of the reentry facility and what population may be appropriate for this facility. The facility is designated as a facility to house sentenced offenders and provide services. There will be a meeting next week to discuss who can potentially be housed there, staffing needs, and what would work best for our community and county. Further discussions will be had in future CCP meetings.

7. FUTURE CCP MEETINGS

Future CCP meetings will be in person starting with the March 2023 meeting. The Governor announced the COVID-19 State of Emergency will end on February 28, 2023. Legislation dictates once emergency order is lifted, we need to return to in-person meetings. There will be some ability to attend remotely under emergency situations. Once that happens, let Amanda and Doug know so they can work on all those emergency provisions and compliance. We will be meeting at the Adult Conference Room in the Hall of Justice, 2nd floor.

8. UCCI UPDATE

The contract with the University of Cincinnati (UCCI) was approved on December 6th by the Board of Supervisors. All criminal justice related departments are invited to attend the training. EBP 101 is a foundational training which will give an overview of evidence-based practices as well as discuss new research. We will be offering this training in-person and virtually. Start talking to your staff about this as we are looking at launching EBP 101 in March or April. Further discussion was had around training schedules and all trainings that will be offered. UCCI will also assist with data and outcomes and putting together a system to capture and report this data. Expect information to go out in late February or early March.

9. OPERATIONAL UPDATES

A. PRETRIAL – Report from Superior Court and the Probation Department

No major operational differences to report this month. We have a quarterly report due at the end of the month. We are still submitting data through the portal which meets SB 129 requirements. We will be having meetings with partner agencies to discuss processes, we may be in communications with groups on this call in the coming months.

B. JAIL POPULATION – Report from the Corrections Department on the current population

There are 214 inmates, of those 40% are sentenced either to local sentence, 2% to DSH, and 1% to Department of Corrections.

C. MENTAL HEALTH DIVERSION – Report from Health and Human Services Agency

Having conversations, doing research, and looking at ways in which we can make this program work for our county. Probation already has some cases, with no formal process yet we are diligently working together to make sure we have a formalized system in place to be able to provide as much service in that area. We will continue to add this on the agenda and will check back at our next CCP meeting to give an additional update.

D. STATUS OF REALIGNMENT FROM PARTNERS – Roundtable discussion from Members and Community Partners

Jail: Activated State run program called Early Access and Stabilization Services, it is meant to get early engagement for those that have been found incompetent to stand trial to try to get the competency process moving even earlier as they await for a bed. The state has partnered with Well-Path who happens to be our medical provider in the jail, so it's just a matter of coordinating the process with our existing mental health services and have had a couple go through. We are also working on another State program to get people enrolled into programs while they are in-custody. We have our contactor and have had weekly meetings, we are waiting on a new date for groundbreaking ceremony of new jail.

Distict Attorney: Introduction of newest Chief Deputy DA , Taryn Hunter.

Public Defender: Thank you to Jennifer and her staff.

HHSA: Seeking to add new positions to support the mental health diversion program.

CEO's Office: No updates.

Police Department: Three new police officers, they are lateral officers from Vallejo and Oakland. They will be going through training program, learn napa culture, and community needs.

CCSC: Working with marketing, hope to provide numbers at the next CCP meeting.

Courts: Yesterday, the Governor released the 23-24 budget. It was generous to the judicial branch. There was lots of incremental funding for certain programs, including CARE Court which includes most of us. We began consolidation of the self-help and family mediation services, these two units have been operating independently for the past decade and now are moving them under a single umbrella and adding staff to enhance services. There has been a rotation change with our supervising Criminal Judge, it is now Judge Langhorne, and in department one, Judge Solga, they will be in there for the next six months. The Historic Courthouse will be participating and partnering with the city with the Napa Light Arts Festival, our building will be lit up from the 19 - 29th on weekends. Students in Napa and Sonoma high schools engaged in civics and the workings of the court, mock trials will be returning to the courthouse on Tuesday evenings in February.
