
# Finances

The total Public Health budget in FY 17-18 was: **\$11,803,051**


There were a total of FTE's 59.9 FTEs in the Public Health Division in FY 17-18

Currently, about 30% of Public Health Funding goes to external providers, maintenance and other service fees, about 60% goes to salaries and benefits and 10% goes to other operating expenditures.

The Public Health Division can't improve population health alone. Public Health has established a wide range of partnerships with other County departments, community organizations and public to ensure services are of the highest quality and that services can have the most impact.

Other Public Health partnerships include the medical community, CBOs, emergency preparedness stakeholders, 0-5 collaborative members, law enforcement as well stakeholders from Resilient Napa, HAPI, Napa Opioid Safety Coalition, Live Healthy Napa County and Tobacco Free Napa Youth Coalition.

# MOVING FORWARD

Over the next year, we will continue to work with the community to advance priority areas outlined in the County Strategic Plan, Community Health Improvement Plan and the Maternal, Child and Adolescent Health (MCAH) 5-Year Needs Assessment. We will continue to stay focused and connect our work with larger county efforts by developing a Division-specific strategic plan. The main areas of focus moving forward include:



## Widening Our Reach & Impact

- Napa County WIC will be among the first sites to pilot the EBT electronic benefit cards for participants leading to reduced stigma and improved access.
- Completion of the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) through community engagement and community-driven solutions
- Focus on Respect and Social Inclusion work as a way to advance health equity
- Working on continuing efforts to reduce food insecurity with individuals directly impacted
- Completing Health Care Coalition grant deliverables
- Continue to refine and streamline Emergency Preparedness efforts
- Collaboration with Tobacco Coalition and Older Adult groups



## Internal Improvement Efforts

- Aligning work with County Strategic Plan and Agency Strategic Plan objectives
- Completion of the Maternal, Child and Adolescent Health Needs Assessment and a Five Year Action Plan.
- Complete the Public Health Workforce Development Assessment
- Streamlining Services and managing program and regulatory changes
- Taking active steps to continue government transparency by refining performance management and quality improvement practices and sharing these results with partners and constituents
- Continuing to take active steps towards obtaining National Public Health Accreditation
