September 12, 2019 – November 6, 2019 (E-173 – E-118)	Signatures-In-Lieu Circulation Period Petitions are available in our office to cover all or any pro-rata portion of the filing fee.
October 28, 2019 – November 6, 2019 (E-127-E-118)	Declaration of Intent for Judicial Candidates Only (The non-refundable filing fee is payable to the Registrar of Voters, and must be paid at the time the Declaration of Intent is filed.)
November 7, 2019 – November 11, 2019* (E-117 – E-113)	Extension Period for Declaration of Intent for Judicial Candidates Declaration of Intent filing is extended ONLY to non-incumbent if the incumbent does not file a Declaration of Intent by November 6, 2019.
November 11, 2019* - December 6, 2019 (E-113 – E-88)	Nomination Period All Filing Fees, Nomination Papers, Candidate Statement of Qualifications and Declaration of Candidacies are due at this time. (The non-refundable filing fee is payable to the Registrar of Voters, and must be paid at the time the candidate obtains the nomination forms.)
December 6, 2019 – December 16, 2019 (E-88-E-78)	Petition Circulation Period to Place Judicial Contest on Ballot Petition can be circulated to place contest(s) on ballot to allow write-ins if only incumbent files. 100 signatures needed to file.
December 7, 2019 – December 11, 2019 (E-87 – E-83)	Nomination Extension Period Nomination Period extended ONLY to non-incumbent if the incumbent does not file Nomination Papers by December 6, 2019.
December 10, 2019 (E-82)	Random Alpha Randomized alphabet drawing done by the Secretary of State to determine the order of candidates on the ballot.
January 6, 2020 – February 18, 2020 (E-57 – E-14)	Write-in Period Nomination Petitions to become a qualified write-in candidate shall be filed during this period.
February 3, 2020 (E-29)	Vote by Mail Period Starts This is the first day that Vote by Mail Ballots can be mailed to voters.
February 17, 2020* (E-15)	15 Day Close This is the last day a voter can register to vote and receive a ballot by mail. All voters that register after this date will need to go to the Election Office or a Vote Center to receive a ballot.
March 3, 2020	Election Day
