NAPA - The County Executive Officer announces 5 openings on the **Napa County Advisory Board on Alcohol and Drug Programs** due to vacancies and expiring terms representing the following categories:

- Two (2) Student Members (shared) representatives

***Recruitments will remain opened until the vacancies are filled.***

Advisory Board Purpose: To participate in the planning process for the development and maintenance of the County alcohol and drug programs; to review and evaluate the County alcohol and drug programs budgets; to advise the County Alcohol and Drug Program Administrator and provide a public forum on the policies and goals of alcohol and drug programs and on other related matters which may be referred to it, or raised by the Board; to review and generally evaluate the community's programs, needs, services, and facilities, encouraging public understanding of the problems of inappropriate use of alcohol and other drugs and encouraging support throughout the County for development and implementation of effective programs, emphasizing prevention and education. The Advisory Board consists of 16 members as follows:

- One (1) - Student (Shared Positions)
- Two (2) - Recovering Community\*\*\*
- One (1) - Law Enforcement\*
- One (1) – Probation\*
- One (1) – Education\*
- One (1) - Alcohol Industry\*
- One (1) - Business Community\*
- Eight (8) - Interested Citizens\*\*

\*Professional members must be from the designated professional organizations listed.

\*\*Interested Citizens must show professional interests in or personal commitment to alleviating problems related to alcoholism or alcohol/drug abuse in the community.

\*\*\*Recovery Community Representative must be sober and clean for two years, and have been participants in Health and Human Services Agency programs.
