## AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO THE MARCH 18, 2020 SHELTER AT HOME ORDER OF THE NAPA COUNTY HEALTH OFFICER

DATE OF AMENDMENT: MARCH 20, 2020

**Please read this Amendment carefully. Violation of or failure to comply with the Order or this Amendment is a misdemeanor punishable by fine, imprisonment, or both. (California Health and Safety Code § 120295, *et seq.*)**


UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF CALIFORNIA HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE SECTIONS 101040, 101085, AND 120175, THE NAPA COUNTY HEALTH OFFICER ("HEALTH OFFICER") ORDERS:

1. Section 10(i) of the March 18, 2020 Shelter at Home Order is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - i. For purposes of this Order, residences include hotels, motels, shared rental units and similar facilities where occupancy is for minimum stays of 30 days. Hotels, motels, shared rental units, and similar facilities that provide transient occupancy for visitors to the County may continue to provide shelter to existing visitors, provided that visitors comply with the Social Distancing Requirements and other provisions of this Order, but shall not receive new occupants nor make any reservations for stays of less than 30 days on any dates in which this Order is in effect, including any extensions, except as specifically authorized by the Health Officer to address the spread or occurrence of COVID-19 in the County.
2. This Amendment is issued based on the evidence cited in the Order of increasing occurrence of COVID-19 throughout the Bay Area, increasing likelihood of occurrence of COVID-19 within the County, and the physical damage to property caused by the virus. This Amendment is also based on scientific evidence and best practices regarding the most effective approaches to slow the transmission of communicable diseases generally and COVID-19 specifically, and evidence that the age, condition, and health of a significant portion of the population of the County places it at risk for serious health complications, including death, from COVID-19.
3. Pursuant to Government Code sections 26602 and 41601 and Health and Safety Code section 101029, the Health Officer requests that the Sheriff and all chiefs of police in the County ensure compliance with and enforce this Amendment. The violation of any provision of this Amendment constitutes an imminent threat to public health.

4. This Amendment shall become effective at 12:01 a.m. on March 21, 2020 and will continue to be in effect until 11:59 p.m. on April 7, 2020, or until it is extended, rescinded, superseded, or amended in writing by the Health Officer.
5. Copies of this Amendment shall promptly be: (1) made available at the County Administration Building, 1195 Third Street, Napa, CA 94559; (2) posted on the County Public Health Department website (<https://www.countyofnapa.org/PublicHealth/>); and (3) provided to any member of the public requesting a copy of this Amendment.
6. If any provision of this Amendment to the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held to be invalid, the remainder of the Amendment, including the application of such part or provision to other persons or circumstances, shall not be affected and shall continue in full force and effect. To this end, the provisions of this Amendment are severable.

**PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTIONS 26602 AND 41601 AND HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE SECTION 101029, THE HEALTH OFFICER REQUESTS THAT THE NAPA COUNTY SHERIFF AND ALL CHIEFS OF POLICE IN THE COUNTY ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH AND ENFORCE THIS AMENDMENT.**
