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**Applicants sought for Napa County Assessment Appeals Board**

NAPA - The County Executive Officer announces three openings on the **Napa County Assessment Appeals Board** representing the following categories:

- One (1) Property Appraiser (term expires September 2, 2022)
- Two (2) Certified Public Accountant/Public Accountant (terms expire September 7, 2023)

***Recruitments will remain opened until the vacancies are filled.***

Board Purpose: On April 10, 2018, pursuant to the provisions of Section 16, Article XIII, of the California Constitution and Revenue and Taxation Code, section 1620 *et seq.*, Napa County established an Assessment Appeals Board under Ordinance No. 1428. The Assessment Appeals Board was created in Napa County to constitute the County Board of Equalization that shall equalize the values of all property on the local assessment roll by adjusting individual assessments. It shall be the duty of the Assessment Appeals Board to exercise their powers in the manner and subject to the limitations specified by California law. The Assessment Appeals Board consists of a total of five members who will all attend each meeting. However, pursuant to Revenue and Taxation Code section 1622.1, the clerk of the Assessment Appeals Board shall designate a three-member panel to act as the assessment appeals board for each meeting. The Board meets the first Thursday of each month at 9:00 a.m. in the Board of Supervisors Chambers.

Qualifications: An applicant must meet one of the following qualifications for membership: (1) Have a minimum of five years professional experience in the State of California as a certified public accountant or public accountant, (2) Be a licensed real estate broker or attorney, (3) Be a property appraiser certified by the Bureau of Real Estate Appraisers, or by the State Board of Equalization. Further, the Board of Supervisors must believe that the applicant has competent knowledge of property appraisal and taxation. New members of the Assessment Appeals Board shall complete a State Board of Equalization course as soon as reasonably possible upon taking office and within the first year of their appointment.
