



Wildfires are the greatest challenge our community has ever faced. These fires threaten our homes, our jobs, and our health. They degrade our water quality and water supply. They devastate our wildlife and Napa's scenic beauty, and spew tons of carbon into the atmosphere.

The financial cost of past wildfires has been astronomical, far beyond anything suggested by opponents arguing against Measure L. While they prefer dependence on state or federal governments, we support taking action to protect our community rather than risk another catastrophe waiting on help that never arrives.

The Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) that Measure L funds needs at least \$45 million over its first 5 years. Opponents misleadingly cite \$138 million for fire prevention in California's State Budget as an alternative, but that's STATEWIDE – or only \$2.3 million per county. So, the state is offering a drop in the fire bucket. And pursuing state grant funding alone as opponents suggest is too sporadic and unreliable to sustain the crucial, time sensitive work in the CWPP.

That's why we need Measure L. The revenues it generates, a large portion coming from tourists, will stay right here in Napa—decreasing the risk of fires and strengthening the response to them—saving lives, homes, communities. And Measure L requires regular audits of how the funds are spent - that's important.
