**FECAL, VOMIT, BLOOD CONTAMINATION
AND DROWNING INCIDENT RECORD**

Fecal, vomit, blood contamination, drowning and near-drowning incident protocols must be recorded as set forth in the California Code of Regulations, Sections 65523 and 65546. The form below includes all of the required record elements. Incident records are required to be maintained at the public pool site and available for inspection for at least two years following the incident. If you have questions regarding the required protocol or record after a fecal, vomit, blood contamination, drowning or near-drowning incident, please contact the Napa County Division of Environmental Health at (707) 253-4471.
