The Napa County Sewage Ordinance requires that fixtures discharging food waste from the food preparation and dishwashing areas of commercial food facilities be connected to an approved grease interceptor prior to connection to an individual or private sewage disposal system.

Due to site constraints and the proposed limited food service operation at \_\_\_\_\_, we are choosing to install an under counter type grease trap. I understand this may not work adequately and my septic system may be negatively impacted by grease entering the disposal field. I am willing to take this risk and accept the conditions as outlined below:

- a) The septic tank must have an effluent filter (minimum 1/32" mesh) installed at the outlet. A representative of this office must inspect the effluent filter prior to final of the project. In addition, a watertight access riser must be installed to access the effluent filter for servicing and inspection.
- b) An annual inspection of the septic tank and effluent filter by a licensed sewage contractor must be completed with the results submitted to this office for our review and approval. The inspection must include observations on grease in the septic tank or lack thereof.
- c) If at anytime in the future the under counter grease trap is determined by this Department not to be working satisfactorily, you will be required to install a remotely located grease interceptor meeting the current Napa County Code requirements.
